Why Should I Care About Lead?

Exposure to lead can harm a child's health

- • Damage to the brain and nervous system,
- • Slowed growth and development,
- • Learning and behavior problems,
- • Hearing and speech problems.



Where is Lead Found in Your Home?

Lead can also be found in:

- Ceramics
- Keys
- Ethnic food and spices
- Cosmetics
- Tracking, Pets



What is Healthy Homes

Identifies 29 other health and safety hazards in a home, including:

- Trips and falls
- Mold
- Asbestos
- Carbon Monoxide, radon and VOC's
- Pests
- Electrical
- Fire
