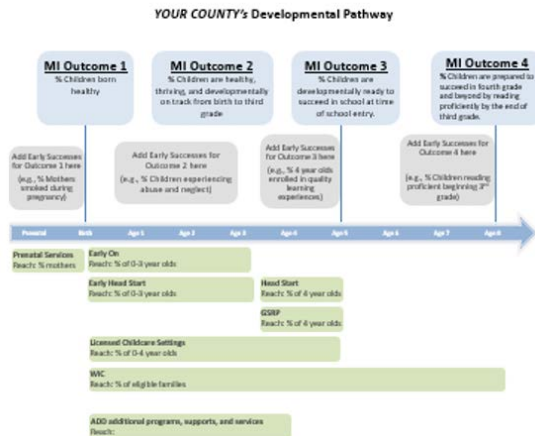
The 11/9/16 Meeting Agenda and 10/12/16 Meeting Notes were approved as stated.

II. Ingham Early Learning Calendar

Thais Rousseau shared the recently printed Ingham Early Learning Calendar. This calendar (modeled after the Kalamazoo Early Literacy Calendar) was created by the Ingham School Readiness Advisory Committee, and was funded by CADL, East Lansing Public Library, and MSUFCU. This calendar provides daily activities and tips related to school readiness for children birth to kindergarten, information regarding child development, and local community resources. A distribution plan has been created, and the calendar will be distributed accordingly. A. Developmental Pathway



A Developmental Pathway helps to answer questions like...

What are the ultimate outcomes we want to bring about for local children?

What "Predictive Indicators" will tell us we're on track to reach these outcomes?

Are local services in place to support children and families in reaching these Early Successes and outcomes?



- Engages collaborative members in **strategic thinking**
 - How are we defining our outcomes?
 - Are our efforts targeting these outcomes?
 - What local service gaps do we see related to these outcomes?
- Informs ongoing System Scanning Efforts
- Talk with partners to find or collect local data
 - Example: School district Kindergarten assessment data for Outcome 3
- Make sure to ask if data can be disaggregated
 - Race, poverty level, location (rural/urban), gender, household type, etc.

- B. Assign time keeper and note taker.
- C. Review data on Prioritization Worksheet. Discuss the indicators that rise to the top as most important for our community, and the rationale for choosing. Record what questions surface about the data and/or if there are other indicators necessary on flip chart paper.
