KIDS Count – Michigan League for Public Policy (MLPP) recently-released the Kids Count data. The 2019 Michigan Data Book includes trends across Michigan counties (and nationally) and ranks the best five and lowest five counties in Michigan according to indicators. MLPP reported Michigan has stagnated compared to other states nationwide. Last year, Ingham County ranked 40th, while the 2019 Ingham County Profile shows the ranking fell to 48th. This data is being used to spark discussion as to why certain data points are improving or continuing to decline.
